
Climate & Culture:

School-Wide
Title I Program***



- ***Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are low achieving or at most risk of falling behind.***
- ***Title I funds are allocated to schools based on the percentage of student receiving free/reduced lunch.***
- ***Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program.***

School-Wide Means:

- The school must collect and analyze student achievement data.
- The school must develop a comprehensive site plan and annually review the effectiveness of the plan.
- The school uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school.
- Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement.
- Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting the state's performance targets.

Rockwood IT has a highly motivated Leadership Team comprised of staff members who understand and care about Rockwood Elementary students and their future.





Parent Involvement Opportunities

- READ, READ, READ with your child for at least 20 minutes **EVERY NIGHT**
 - Attend Parent/Teacher Conferences - at least twice a year and any additional requests
 - Attend family events offered by the school
 - Communicate regularly with your teacher regarding your child's participation and progress
 - Be an active monitor of your child's academic growth!
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Parent's Right to Know: Student Achievement

- As soon as state testing results are available, each parent will receive a report, which will give details regarding their child's performance.
 - Attend parent-teacher conferences at least twice a year to receive detailed information regarding your child's academic growth and achievement.
 - Teachers are always available (and are strongly encouraged) to discuss your child's assessment results to help you better understand their performance and ways to help them improve.
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Parent's Right to Know:
Non-Highly Qualified Teachers

- Schools are required to notify parents if their child has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

Parent's Right to Request Meetings

- Upon the request of parents, the school must provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children.
- The school must respond to any such suggestions as ~~soon~~ as practicably possible.
