
This graph shows the daily membership for the district through the end of the school year. The district's peak enrollment for the school year occurred on September 19, 2012 with 39,883 students enrolled.




















Competitive Edge

The Competitive Edge program makes it possible for thousands of students to participate in artistic and academic competitions. Grants range from \$1,000 to \$2,500 to pay for fees, transportation, meals and lodging. By competing, students gain a sense of purpose that builds their confidence, validates their talents, and sets them on a track to life-long success.

Advancing Teaching Excellence

Research shows of the in-school factors impacting education, teacher quality is critical. That's why the Foundation makes investing in teachers one of its top priorities through the Jean G. Gumerson Endowment for the Pursuit of Teaching Excellence. Teachers can receive a \$2,500 scholarship to pursue National Board certification, and NBCTs can receive a \$1,150 scholarship to renew their certification. OKCPS teachers who want to learn more about the National Board process can take a pre-candidacy course offered each spring. Teachers also can Take One!, the first step of the National Board process, and an entire school staff can experience Take One! as a group.
