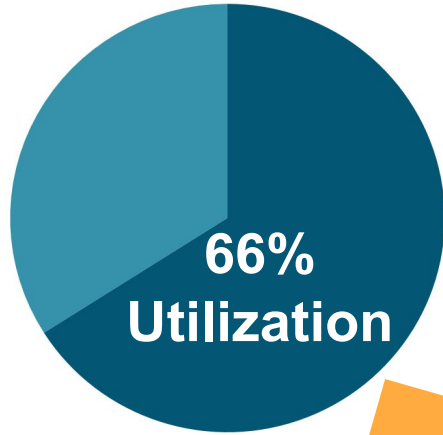

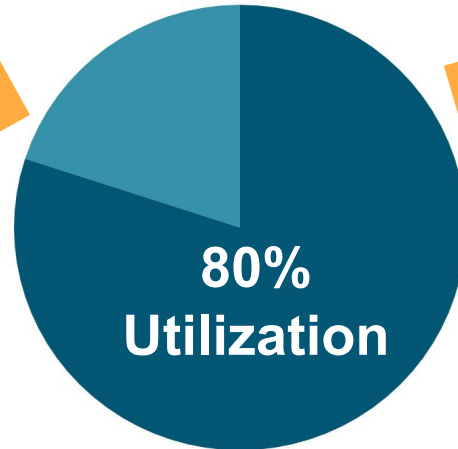

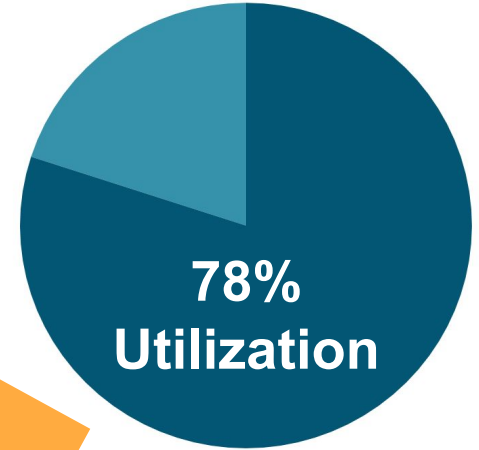

Last year, 40% of elementaries had grades with only 1 teacher

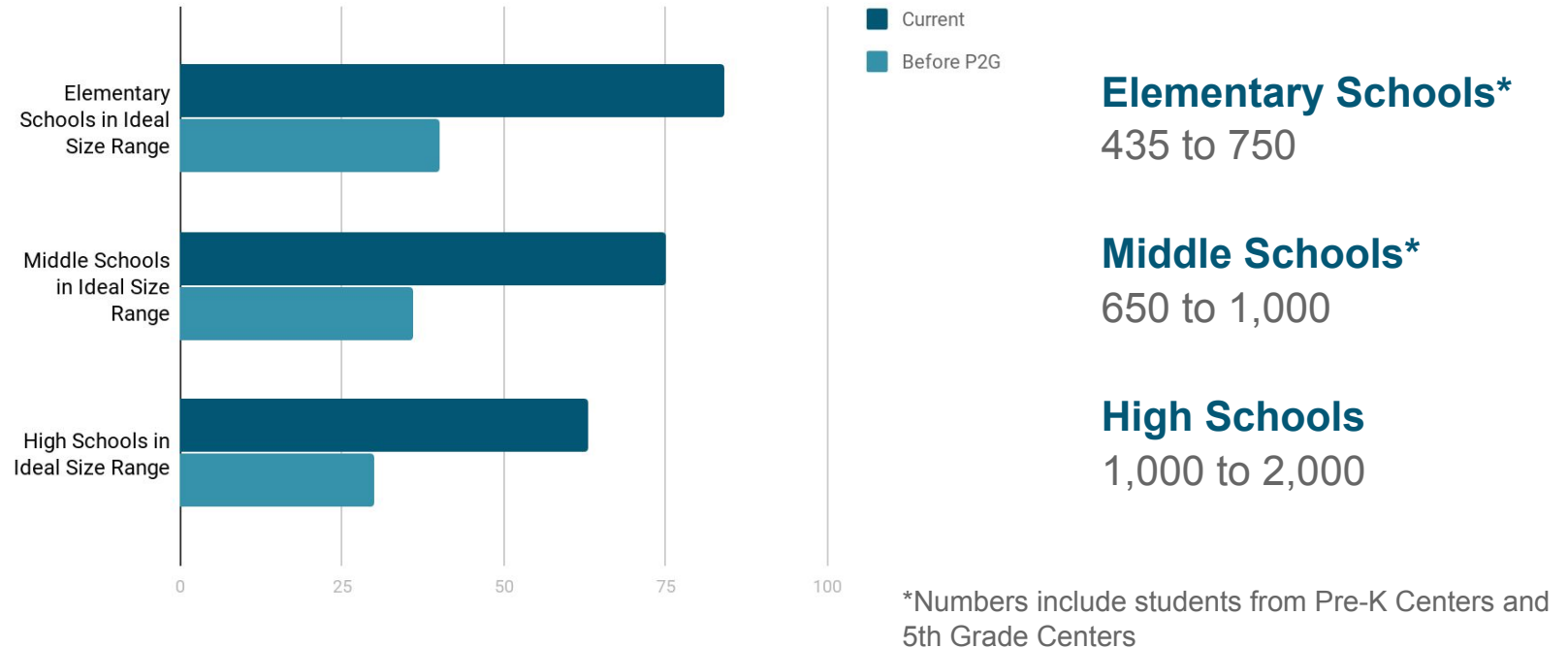


This year and next, all elementaries have 3-teacher teams at every grade, K-4

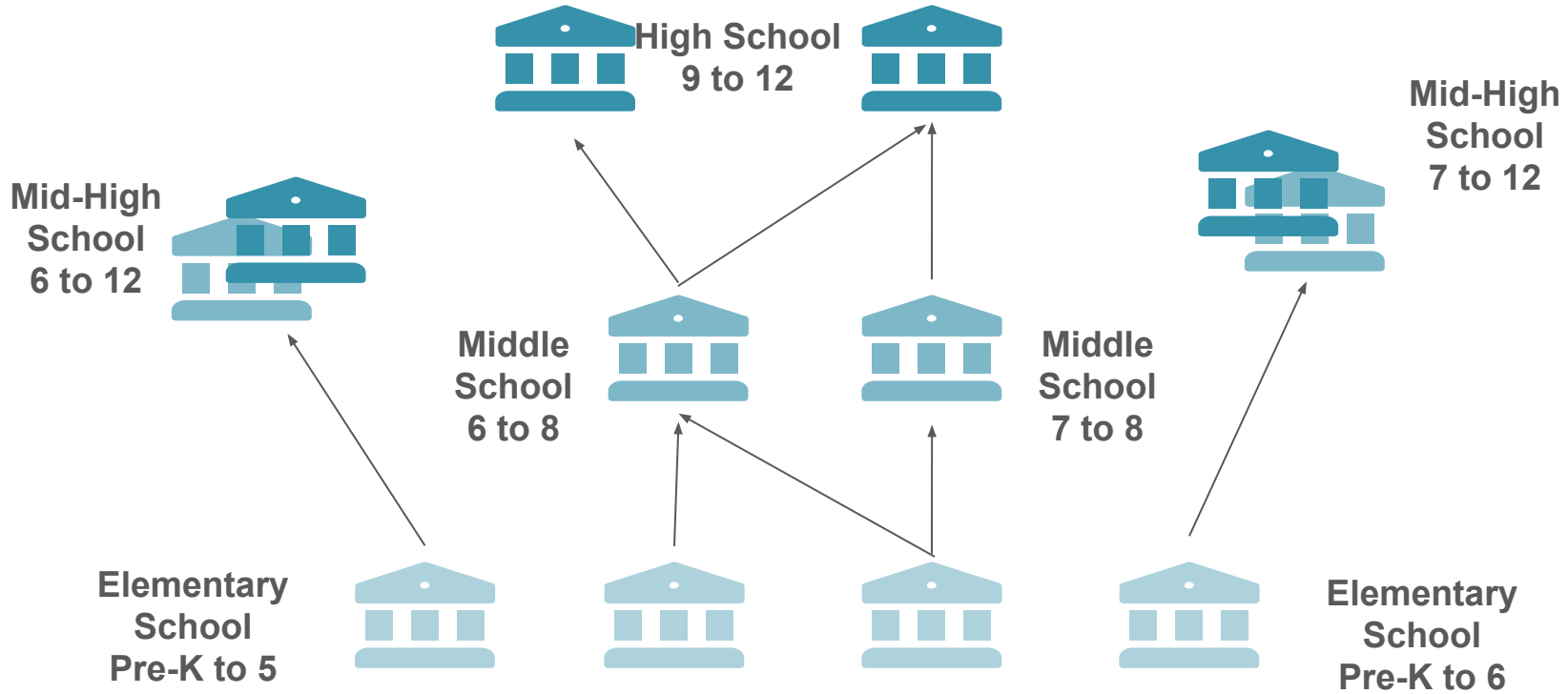


School Size Implications

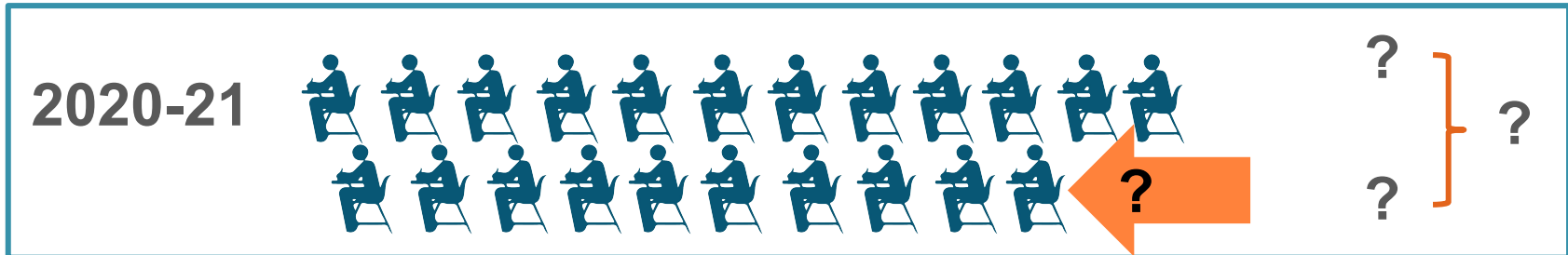

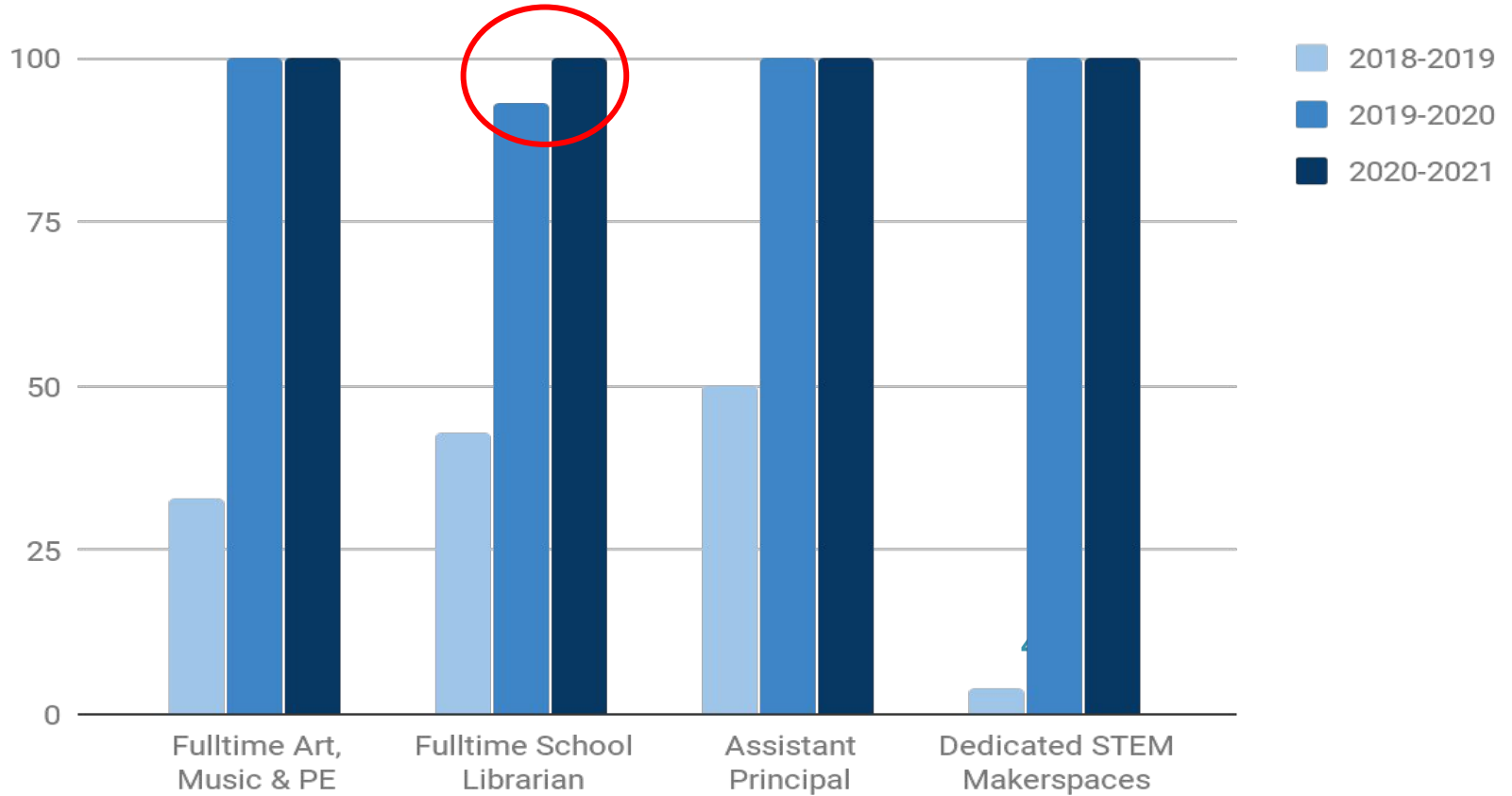

Successful application school programs increased enrollment by 1,708

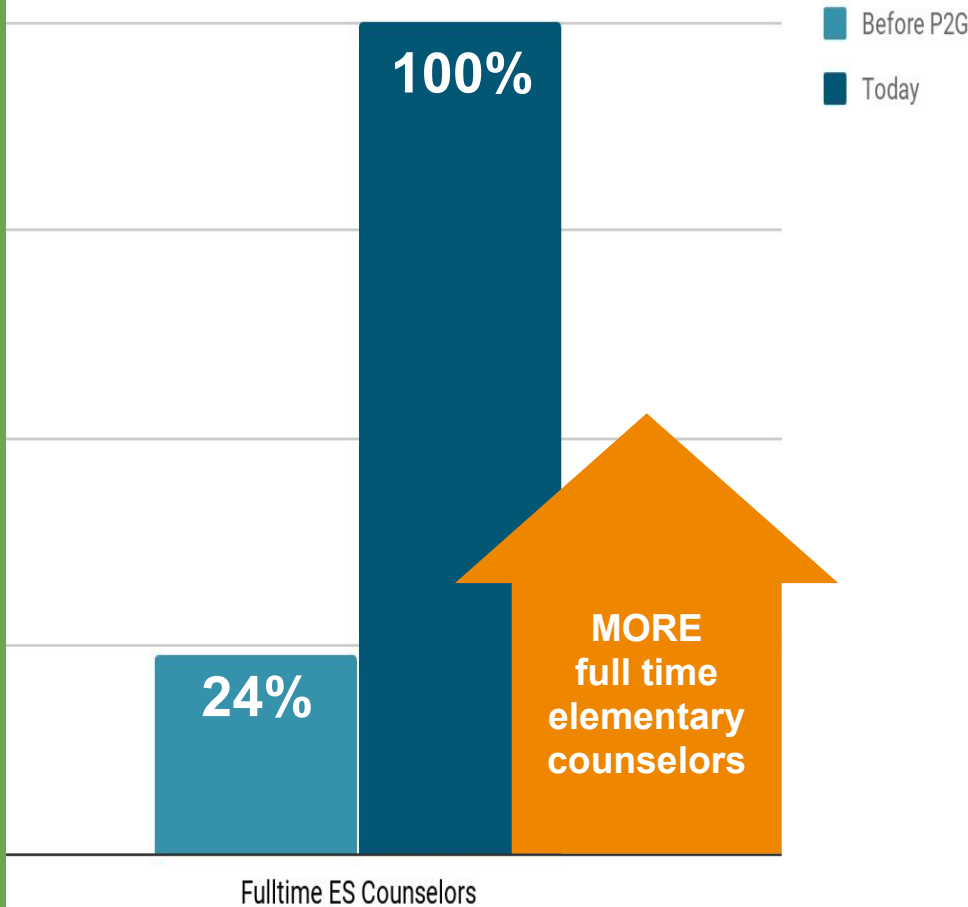
Every 6th grader has access to athletics, fine & performing arts and other co-curriculars (In 2018 only 1 in 5 did)

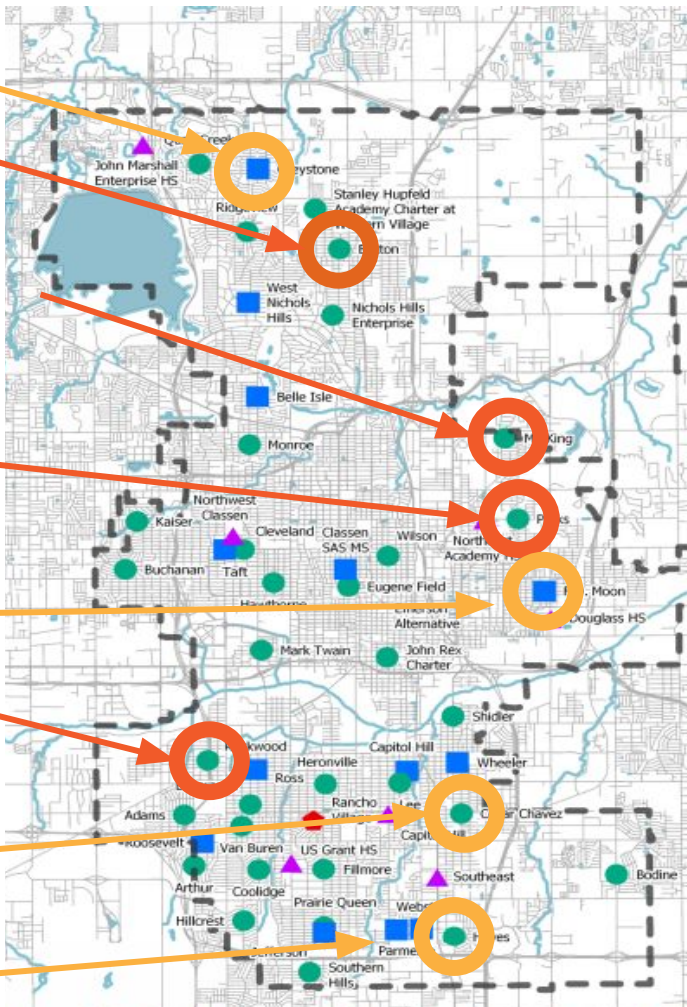
