2021 Summer Learning Mission

The goal of the OKCPS Summer Enhancement program is to support students in their continuous improvement through an ambitious program that is established with student achievement at the forefront. The 2021 Elementary School Summer Enhancement program will focus on students in need of increased academic support in English Language Arts and Mathematics. Our six week program focuses on hiring the most qualified professionals in our district to serve our students in a face to face setting while helping close achievement gaps while supporting healthy development.

2021 Summer Learning Overview

Campus Culture

Our elementary summer school sites want to create a welcoming, positive campus culture is the key to the overall success of OKCPS Summer Learning.

Campus Climate

Elementary summer school's primary goal is to support literacy, mathematical development, and promote academic success. At the same time we also want students to be excited for each day. The summer school lessons are designed to engage students with real world curriculum from Scholastic and HMH. Learning is infused throughout the morning's activities.

2021 Summer Learning *Information*

Dates of Program:

- The Elementary enhancement program will offer two 3 Week sessions (June and July).
 - o June 7-June 25
 - o July 5-July 23
- Classes will be Monday-Thursday from 8:30am-12:30pm.

Location: Classes will be held at seven elementary locations throughout the district. Arthur Elementary, Britton Elementary, Cesar Chavez Elementary, Esperanza Elementary, Hawthorne Elementary, Ridgeview Elementary, and Rogers Elementary.

Student Eligibility: We will use the following criteria to determine what students will benefit from this program:

Parent Request

- a. Parent Request: In the event that a parent makes an inquiry for their student to attend summer school, for any reason, please ensure that they are enrolled. No other criteria needs to be included with a Parent Referral.
- 2. Teacher Referral (Minimum Expectations)
 - Teacher Referral: Communication should be led by the campus principal in order to get teacher input for students who may benefit from summer learning (more details below).
 - b. Attendance- Those students not marked absent more than EIGHT times since January 2021.
 - Student Data- Reading and Math iStation and ELQA scores should be used to target attendance for Summer School Enhancement
 - Reading Enhancement- Those students in Level 1 in the categories of Phonemic Awareness, Vocabulary, and Comprehension will be targeted for Summer School Enhancement.
 - ii. Math Enhancement- Those students in Level 1 in the category of Number Sense will be targeted for Summer School Enhancement.



- iii. ELQA scores should be used to target attendance for Pre-K Summer School Enhancement. (Example: Upper Case alphabet/Letter Sounds lower than 6; Numbers less than 50%.)
- iv. Masteryconnect ELA and Math Benchmarks for 3rd-6th grade students from Quarter 3 and 4 can be considered for the target audience.
- d. Social Emotional Aspect- Students who would greatly benefit from strengthening their social, emotional, and academic skills in a small classroom setting.
- e. Student Core Class Failures (Not reflected by failure to submit work.)

Staffing: The goal for the 2021 Summer Learning face to face instruction is that a student receives their instruction from a staff member of their home campus. It may be necessary to have instruction from another certified OKCPS Staff member who may not reside at the student's home campus. However, all staff will be current OKCPS certified teachers.

Transportation: Transportation will be provided Monday through Thursday for each student. OKCPS Transportation will use a "hub system" in which students report to their local designated school campus and an OKCPS Bus will then take them to their assigned summer learning location (Seven elementary sites).

Elementary Enhancement Bus Pick Up

Curriculum: Elementary summer learning principals have been working closely with the OKCPS Curriculum department to identify and develop a highly engaging curriculum for both English and Math. English will be using a highly engaging summer specific curriculum developed by Scholastic called Summer Lit Camp. Summer Lit. Camp is a breakthrough summer literacy program that combines reading and writing lessons with an interactive summer camp approach. Each Lit Camp bundle includes 150-160 diverse grade-specific texts. Those lessons are aligned to social-emotional learning using the "7 Strengths" framework. Do the Math has been organized for 2021 Summer school as all schools are experiencing gaps in mathematics.

Student Nutrition Services: All students will receive a breakfast upon arrival at their summer learning site each day. Breakfast will be served from 8:00am to 8:20am allowing all students the opportunity to consume their meal prior to the start of instruction. Lunch will be served each day at the summer learning site and time will be provided for consumption so no food or drink will be accepted on OKCPS Busses.
