PARKING / DROP OFF / PICK UP

Classen has many new students starting school this year. Please be respectful of drop off and pick up areas for our students. In order to keep everyone safe, please do not drop off or pick up students by driving through a parking lot.

All student drop off and pick up should do so by driving from **North to South on Ellison.** Cars should pull up to the school, drop off students, and keep moving. Students enter the building through the **Auditorium doors**.

If students are driving, parking is behind the school and entry is through the cafeteria side door.

Students riding a bus, enter the doors near the cafeteria.

Drop off and Pick up should not block parked cars on the north and south ends of the building.

Classen SAS is situated in a neighborhood and landlocked. Our parking and drop off / pick up space is very tight. Please be patient during these times. We are grateful for every student that attends our wonderful school! It is important that these guidelines are followed to keep every student safe.

DRESS CODE

The school dress code is found on the school website, and below in this newsletter. Please make sure that your student is attending school in the appropriate attire. Last year, some parents came together to review the dress code and make suggestions for change. As of this time, those changes have not been approved by the district and the current dress code is in place. Every student at Classen SAS is on a special transfer to attend and is expected to obey the school rules.

GENERAL

No insignias, logos, labels, words or pictures on clothing unless otherwise stated.

PANTS / SHORTS / SKIRTS / DRESSES

Uniform colors are: BLACK; KHAKI; NAVY for pants, shorts, skirts or dresses.

Pants, shorts, skirts or dresses must be solid colored black, khaki or navy.

SHIRTS

Uniform colors are: WHITE; ROYAL BLUE; BLACK for shirts.

Shirts must be solid colored white, royal blue, or black.

Shirts must be sleeved, buttoned or zipped.

- Classen SAS shirts may be worn.
- Shorts or skirt lengths must be lower that finger tip of the wearer with arm fully extended.
- Undershirts or Leggings must be WHITE; ROYAL BLUE; BLACK; NAVY

FOOTWEAR is required at all times. Flip-flops and house shoes are not permitted.

OUTERWEAR

Students may wear solid colored WHITE, ROYAL BLUE, BLACK sweatshirts, sweaters or vests. OKCPS and /or Classen logos may be visible on outerwear.

Coats may not be worn inside the building unless an exception is made by the principal for exceptionally cold weather.

HATS / JEWELRY / ACCESSORIES

Students may not wear caps, hats, or head coverings except for religious beliefs, medical reasons, or approved by the school administration for special activity.

Jewelry and accessories that pose a safety concern are prohibited.

Belts must be solid colored, worn in the belt loop and appropriately fastened with a plain buckle.

EXCEPTIONS

Friday is spirit day. Solid uniform colored jeans may be worn with school t-shirt.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance is very important. Please review the Student Handbook for more information. Students must be in class at least 88% of days in order to receive credit. (10 days of absences) Activity absences are restricted to 10 days as well. Please be aware of your student's absences.

SCHOOL GOALS

Last year, the goals listed below were some of our school goals. They remain goals this year, and others will be added soon.

- 1) Improve attendance and reduce tardies.
 - a. Did you know that attendance is a factor in our school report card? Research shows that attendance in class greatly impacts student success.
 - b. Attendance is calculated for middle and high school.
- 2) Promote a clean campus.
- 3) Improve dress code compliance.
 - a. Please assist the school to improve our compliance with dress code. Please make sure to send your student to school in the appropriate attire. The school dress code can be found on the website.
- 4) Improve student support systems.
 - a. Advisory has been implemented this school year. It serves several purposes:
 - i. Announcements are delivered during advisory to protect instructional time during first period.

- ii. Counselors are able to meet with groups of students during this time to not interrupt instructional time.
- iii. No classes are being held during the lunch/advisory or advisory/lunch hour so that no classes are interrupted.
- iv. Grade level specific instruction or information may be delivered to students during this time.
- 5) Appreciate staff, students, parents and patrons.
 - a. Thank you to PTSA and ACE!
 - b. PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) is being implemented this school year. It impacts all of our goals as we are making attempts to provide positive reinforcement to students making good choices.
- 6) Artistic and Academic Excellence are the norm.
 - a. Excellence is our day to day expectation. Our students are amazingly talented people that we celebrate and push to continue their path toward artistic and academic excellence.
 - b. Student Engagement is our school practice where we are placing focus. Please ask your student how they are engaging in classes.
 - c. Small focus groups are being created to assist students that may need help to improve standardized test scores.
